HPLS has zero tolerance for abuse or sexual abuse perpetrated on children or vulnerable people. Inappropriate interaction with children will result in termination of the agreement with the contractor and a report to the police and any other appropriate authorities.

Appropriate displays of affection when working with children and families include:

- A high-five, handshake, fist bump, or elbow touch
- An encouraging pat on the back
- A tap/hand on shoulder to help a student focus
- Handholding if the child requests or initiates it
- Sitting in your lap if the child requests or initiates it
- Caring for a child if they become ill or hurt- taking their temperature/ feeling their forehead, holding an injury to assess treatment, etc.

Inappropriate physical contact or displays of affection when working with children and families include:

- physical force such as grabbing, pushing, hitting, kicking
- overly affectionate touches such as caressing or fondling
- touching a child below his/her waist
- touching a camper in the chest/breast area
- any other inappropriate or sexual interaction even if no physical contact is involved
- cursing, using inappropriate language or content, talking about illegal activity or content
- connecting with children under 18 through social media platforms (this includes private messaging, friending, and following)
- displaying favoritism when working with multiple children at a time
